Quarterly Report October - December, 2024

Message from the PRESIDENT:



1. Programs conducted at The National Association for the Blind, Karnataka in this Quarter included :
 - Orientation & Mobility Training Program - 27 students trained
 - Basic Concepts of Computer under Digital Literacy Program – 19 students trained
 - Call Centre Training – 17 Students trained
 - Community Based Rehabilitation team conducted rural Mobility in 4 Taluks - 60 students trained
 - ITCB, Mysore Training – 10 Students (6 VI & 4 SHI)
 - Assessment of trainers for spoken English classes- 10 Trainers

In addition, NABK, as Authorized Training Partner & Affiliated Training Center with SCPwD -**Skill Council for Persons with Disability**) has conducted, SCPwD Certified Training Programs in this quarter:

- For Speech and Hearing Trainees (SHI) as “**Food & Beverage” service assistant –**
 - 2nd batch of 22 students graduated and placed in various hotel
 - 3rd batch of 40 trainees have registered and undergoing training and will Graduate in February 2025, Royal Orchid are our Knowledge Partner.
- For Visually Impaired Trainees as “ **Warehouse Packer”**
 - The First Batch of 22 trainees have registered and are undergoing training and will graduate in January 2025
 - II Batch of 19 trainees have registered and undergoing training.
- For Visually Impaired Trainees as “**Customer Care Executive”** 17 students will graduate in January 2025.

2. NABK was chosen by Rural Development & Panchayat Raj Department (RDPR), Govt of Karnataka for a project called ‘Enable all Rural Libraries to become accessible to users with Visual Disabilities’ We have trained already 65+ RDPR staffs on Usage of Assistive Devices are looking forward to roll out phase 2 in January 2025.
3. The National Association for the Blind, Karnataka in Partnership with Community-Based Inclusive Development (CBID), have trained 362 Village Rehabilitation Workers across 10 districts in Karnataka. NABK Trainers delivered the session on Orientation and Mobility (O&M).
4. NABK continues to support **TARVI - Training and Resource Center for Visually Impaired** sponsored by MICROLAND Foundation (run by Kinder Trust), as Technical Consultant” for all their training programs (preparing schedule, periodic assessments and placement support) for their Trainers and Trainees. We had 2 Trainers from Kinder Trust for TOT Program, two has completed the course. As of date 15 students have graduated in Basic Computer Course and 7 Students have been placed in different organizations. 9 students have enrolled for the 4 Batch.

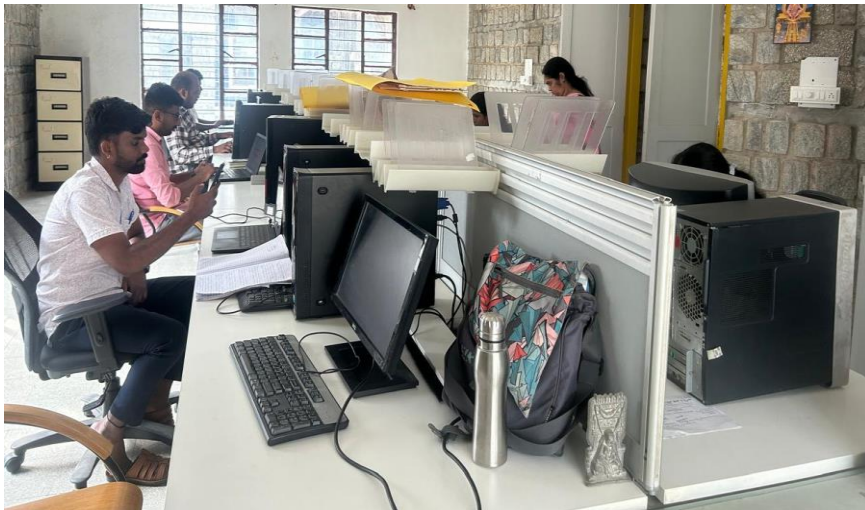

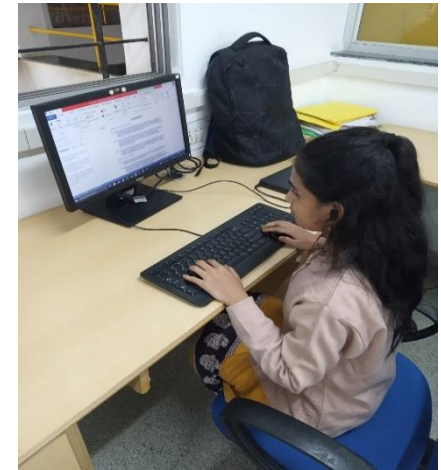
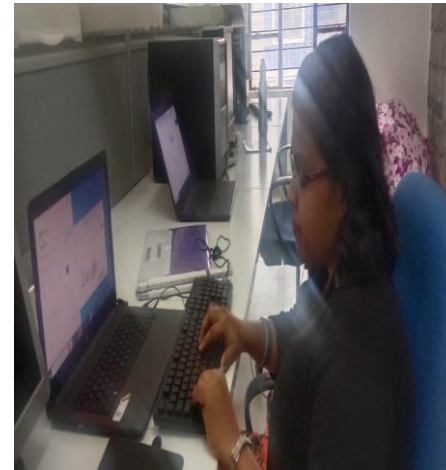

Corporate Outreach

It has been our constant endeavor to ensure that we make the visually impaired in Karnataka lead a life of dignity through socio-economic independence. We train them on Mobility and employability skills, which includes white collar, blue collar or self-employment skills.

We explore possibility of hiring visually impaired in blue collar or white collar jobs with potential employers.

In this direction, we have taken the following steps:

NABK adopts a new model of approach - TRAIN & HIRE. Under this new model, we are working with employers on the following lines:

- ✓ Employer training personnel to initially train our trainers on job role skills.
- ✓ Shortlisting of willing & eligible trainees / ex trainees by NABK & employer.
- ✓ Shortlisted trainees are employed as Interns/Apprentices on a regular stipend to cover their costs of accommodation and food at NABK along with some nominal amount to pay for their personal expenditure.
- ✓ Training to be provided by our trainers under the supervision of employer trainer.
- ✓ Internship objective would be to teach interns the job skills required – but also get them up to speed on the rigor of an 8 hour shift along with the safety, quality and performance expectations.
- ✓ Replica of specific job role’s work environment set up at our Bengaluru campus by employers.
- ✓ Identification of safe accommodation near factory vicinity, where the interns could stay after initial training at NABK. One of our trainers to handhold them during this period, till they gain required confidence.
- ✓ Post training and performance assessment, those selected will be taken on payrolls of the employer. Those not shortlisted, will receive a certificate jointly issued by NABK + Employer to enable them to seek jobs in related industry.

On similar lines, we are continuously engaging with several other employers regarding placement opportunities for our vision & hearing impaired trainees.
