We had 2 Trainers from Kinder Trust for TOT Program, two has completed the course. As of date 15 students have graduated in Basic Computer Course and 7 Students have been placed in different organizations. 8 students have enrolled for the 5 Batch.





Corporate Outreach

It has been our constant endeavor to ensure that we make the visually impaired in Karnataka lead a life of dignity through socio-economic independence. We train them on Mobility and employability skills, which includes white collar, blue collar or self-employment skills.

We explore possibility of hiring visually impaired in blue collar or white collar jobs with potential employers.

In this direction, we have taken the following steps:

NABK adopts a new model of approach - TRAIN & HIRE. Under this new model, we are working with employers on the following lines:

- ✓ Employer training personnel to initially train our trainers on job role skills.
- √ Shortlisting of willing & eligible trainees / ex trainees by NABK & employer.
- ✓ Shortlisted trainees are employed as Interns/Apprentices on a regular stipend to cover their costs of accommodation and food at NABK along with some nominal amount to pay for their personal expenditure.
- ✓ Training to be provided by our trainers under the supervision of employer trainer.
- ✓ Internship objective would be to teach interns the job skills required but also get them up to speed on the rigor of an 8 hour shift along with the safety, quality and performance expectations.
- ✓ Replica of specific job role's work environment set up at our Bengaluru campus by employers.
- ✓ Identification of safe accommodation near factory vicinity, where the interns could stay after initial training at NABK. One of our trainers to handhold them during this period, till they gain required confidence.
- ✓ Post training and performance assessment, those selected will be taken on payrolls of the employer. Those not shortlisted, will receive a certificate jointly issued by NABK + Employer to enable them to seek jobs in related industry.

On similar lines, we are continuously engaging with several other employers regarding placement opportunities for our vision & hearing impaired trainees.


