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## Message from President

On behalf of the Governing Council of The National Association for the Blind - Karnataka I would like to place before you our annual report for the year 2021-22.

*Our vision - From Darkness to Light* seems like an apt way to describe how the past year has been. We continued to support our visually impaired beneficiaries during pandemic in the following ways:

- Despite covid, our Mysuru center continued functioning & conducted Industrial training for the 32nd batch of trainees consisting of 33 new trainees.- 29 HI & 4 VI
- Conducted mobility training for 5 Day-scholars at Bengaluru center, since hostel facility was inoperative due to covid lock down.
- We experimented with conducting online mobility training on a trial basis, by leveraging our mobility training videos and Local sighted caretakers / Family members
- Post covid, we restarted our CBR activities in 5 taluks and the statistics for Nov 21-Mar 22 are as given below:

- We are glad to announce that we have restarted all our training programs i.e. Mobility / TOT / Basic computers at Bengaluru center. Currently our in-class Mobility training to 13 beneficiaries, Computer training to 7 trainees & TOT training to 6 trainees are underway.
- We took the opportunity to redo our Bengaluru center, while it was closed due to covid. Our Mysuru center too undertook repair works.. Please do visit our campuses to absorb the **New, Vibrant & Feel good experience**.
- At our Mysuru center, JSS PHC & JSS Dental college conducted General health & Dental check up. Also, Covid Vaccination Drive was carried out with the support of PKTB hospital. We stringently adhered to covid safety protocols, to run these programs.
- During covid, we worked with Volvo India / BBMP / CII Karnataka / AyurVAID Hospitals / IKEA India to set up Covid Care Centre at our Bengaluru campus. However, we were advised by local authorities to relocate it to local government hospital.
- Efforts are on in full swing to convert our MOU with NSDC to make NABK a full fledged affiliated center for our Employment / Self-employment programs and also evolve NABK into a Train-the-Trainer Academy.
- We are continuously engaging with several employers for placement opportunities to our trainees. Also, plans are on to simulate employer specific job role environment at NABK so as to make our trainees **Job ready** on their first day at workplace.

During covid, we worked with skeletal staff to carry out our operations at Bangalore, Mysuru, CBR through online and offline mode, which itself is a testimony of our commitment to this cause. We invite you to learn more about our initiatives and contribute to help us continue to serve visually impaired across Karnataka.

## Highlights of 2021-22

### NABK and its tryst with Pandemic.

- Despite covid, our Mysuru center continued functioning & conducted Industrial Training for the 32nd batch of trainees consisting of 33 new trainees - 29 VI & 4 HI. All covid protocols were adhered to.
- Also, our Mysuru center successfully conducted annual exams for 25 students from the graduating 31st batch.
- We experimented with conducting Remote / Online Mobility Training on a trial basis by leveraging our Train-the-Trainer video library and involving Caretakers / Family members of the Vision Impaired.
- Conducted Reorientation program to NABK and CBR field staff.
- Conducted Orientation program to new CBR staff.
- Conducted orientation program to CBR team on Computers and NVDA software..
- Post covid, we restarted our CBR operations and the statistics for Nov 21- Mar 22, are as given below i.e. Survey, Identification, Training and Placement

- At our Mysuru center, JSS PHC & Dental college conducted General health & Dental check up / Covid Vaccination Drive carried out with the support of PKTB hospital. We ensured complete covid safety precautions, to run this program.
- During covid, we worked with Volvo India Pvt Ltd in partnership with BBMP, CII Karnataka, AyurVAID Hospitals and IKEA India to set up a new 40-bed Covid Care Centre at our Bengaluru campus. However, we were advised by the local authorities to relocate it to new Karnataka Institute of Endocrinology in C V Raman Nagar, Bangalore. Persons with Disability – especially the Visually Impaired – needing medical care related to covid were given priority at this CCC.
- We took the opportunity to carry out essential renovation and repair works at our Bengaluru center, while it was closed due to covid. Our Mysuru center too undertook repair works. Details of the same are in the forthcoming slides.
- Dialogue is underway with NSDC–SCPWD to expand our Job Oriented Vocational Training Programs and also evolve NABK into a Train-the-Trainer Academy.



## Foundation Course

- Our Foundation Course includes Rehabilitation, Orientation and Mobility, Life Skills, Vocational Training and Placement / Self-Employment.
- During the rehabilitation process, our counsellors assist individuals (and their families) to adjust to their vision loss and reassure that they can manage their socio-economic life independently. We help them apply for Government provisions such as Disability ID cards, Pensions, Local Panchayat registration.
- The Mobility & Orientation training program course is a 6-week which covers: Rules of walking in enclosed & public space using a cane, Negotiating steps and escalators, Commuting in a Bus & metro, Learning techniques to map and memorize routes, layouts in rural and urban areas.

## Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Program

- CBR is an effort to enhance and facilitate an independent & self sustained life for visually impaired beneficiaries in the rural segment.
- As part of our rural outreach initiatives, we have established taluk level centers and extended our reach to remote rural Karnataka. Our CBR programs takes our cause to the grass root level, enabling the visually challenged in the rural segment to lead a life of independence and self-sustenance.
- NABK does door to door surveys to identify and rehabilitate visually impaired beneficiaries. Also guides them through the entire formality to avail benefits under government scheme for vision impaired.
- During the year 2021-22, most of our operations were suspended due to covid pandemic. However, NABK continued to support our visually impaired beneficiaries, especially in rural Karnataka – By assisting them to address their needs such as Medicines, Government pensions, Food rations, etc. Our field coordinators also ensured awareness about Personal hygiene, Social distancing, Usage of face masks and Sanitization.
- We have offered Remote / Online Mobility Training by using our Train-the-Trainer video library and involving Caretakers / Family members of the Vision Impaired - Thus addressing the need of social distancing norms
- We conducted Reorientation Program to NABK & CBR field staff / Orientation program to CBR team on Computers & NVDA software / Orientation program for new CBR recruits.
- In collaboration with the local community, local NGOs and the local Panchayat, we have surveyed 1469 villages and identified 1921 Visually Impaired persons in 2021-22.. We provided Mobility Training to 97 Vision Impaired and successfully placed 3 Visually Impaired beneficiaries in local employment

## Rural Employment

NABK trains visually impaired in rural areas on Mobility, Vocational and Entrepreneurial skills to become socio-economic independent & be self-sustained..

- NABK assists the visually impaired to set up Kirana shops, Weighing scales, Cattle rearing and other Local entrepreneurial opportunities / Support them with local employment.
- We also plan to empower self-employed Kirana shop beneficiaries by guiding them through Business Process Analysis so as to rekindle entrepreneurial spirit.
- NABK also helps self employed visually impaired set up Self Help Group (SHG) or Sangha. This sangha is a separate legal entity with its own bank account and is managed by visually impaired.
- Last financial year, NABK has enabled 3 visually impaired trainees to get local employment.
- Also talks are underway with garment factories at Arsikere & Hassan for local placement to our CBR beneficiaries.
- We are actively engaged with NSDC-SCPwD to get affiliation for our Employment / Self-employment programs.
- NABK plans to restart Re-caning training in Hassan.
- NABK plans to provide 10 days Animal Husbandry training in coordination with RSETI-Canara Bank, Hassan. The goal is to make trainees self employed based on an entrepreneurial model.





## Blue Collar - Job Oriented Training Programs

- NABK trainers work with potential employers, identify specific job roles for visually impaired and jointly create specifically designed training programs to impart skills required for the job role.
- Despite covid, our Mysuru center continued functioning & conducted Industrial training for the 32nd batch of trainees consisting of 33 new trainees consisting of 29 VI & 4 HI.
- Also our 31<sup>st</sup> batch of trainees graduated during August 2021.

### Light Engineering Training - Mysore

- NABK Light Engineering course at Mysuru has been successfully running since 1989. This course is designed for Visually and Hearing Impaired beneficiaries.
- The Curriculum covers Filing & Fitting Jobs, Measuring Tools, Marking Tools, Hand Tools, Facing, Turning, Drilling, Boring, Shearing Machine, Basic Electrical works, Plastic injection moulding, Recaning, Coir mat making etc.

### Apparel Industry - Bengaluru

- Due to covid, we could not continue with this program during last year. This course has got a prospective market in the Garment industry & opportunity of self-employment.
- The Curriculum covers both theoretical & practical lessons on Introduction to Sewing, Raw materials, Tools & Equipment, Folding of various Garments, Button Locking ( Shirts, trousers, tops etc.), Hand Sewing, Button & Hook Stitching, Garment Packaging, etc.

### Assembly and Packing :

- NABK "On the Job" training program is when Trainers from NABK work with an organization to understand their needs and see where our beneficiaries can fit in
- We are continuously engaging with several employers for placement opportunities to our trainees. Also, plans are on to simulate employer specific job role environment at NABK so as to make our trainees job ready on their first day at workplace.



## White Collar Job Oriented Training Program

NABK also provides White-Collar Job Oriented training to Visually and Hearing Impaired beneficiaries so as to facilitate local employment.

Last year due to covid, we could not run this training program. We opened our Bengaluru campus during March 2022 and since then a batch of 7 trainees are undergoing training in basic computer concepts.

Training programs provided at Bengaluru center are:-

### BASIC COMPUTER TRAINING

- NABK has been providing computer training since 2000 and the course covers basic of computer concepts (Keyboard orientation, MS Office and Internet) with the help of a screen reader software - Non-visual Desktop Access.
- This Course also includes training in Spoken English, Life skills, Communication skills, Job interview skills & General Knowledge.
- Training for a batch of 7 trainees is underway, since reopening of Bengaluru campus in March 2022.

### CALL CENTRE & FRONT DESK OFFICE TRAINING

- NABK had earlier launched the Call Centre and Front Desk Executive Training program.
- Program is accredited by NSDC-SCPwD.
- NABK received an award for the successful training of 7 candidates.
- 3 of our trainers were certified by SCPwD after undergoing training. This certificate is mandatory for trainers to be eligible to train
- Till date, we have completed 4 batches of Call Center training – 2 batches on campus for 6 months and 2 batches online for 2 months.
- Due to covid last year, we could not conduct Offline / Online Call Center Training.
- Efforts are on to place our ex-trainees in white collar jobs.

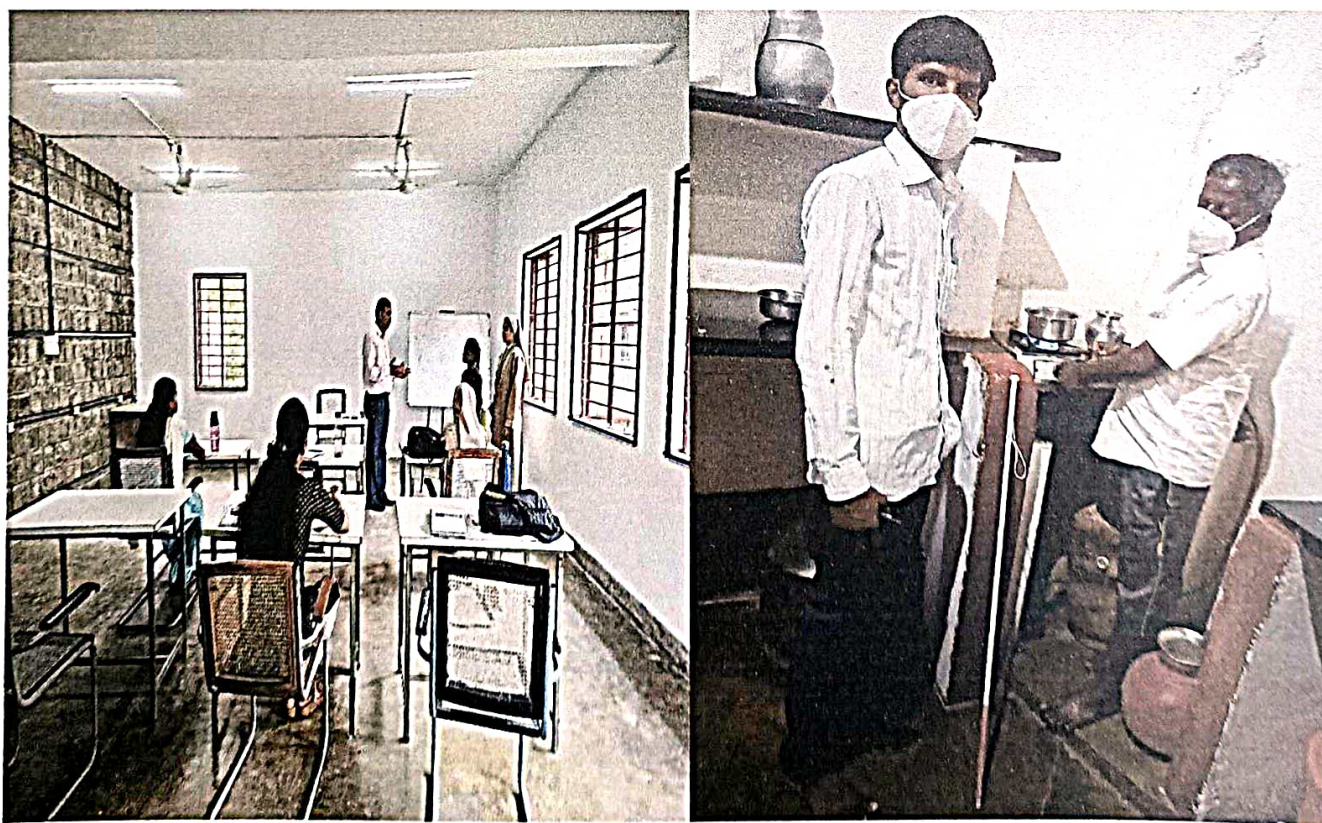


## Capacity Building

NABK is the one of the few institution in the country which has a Train-the-Trainer program for Orientation & Mobility Training, Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Training, Digital Literacy Training and Light Engineering Training.

### Following were the programs undertaken by NABK towards Capacity Building :

- New CBR field coordinators underwent training program on CBR activities in Bengaluru / Field training in taluk center along with existing CBR team.
- 3 days reorientation program was conducted for NABK and CBR field staff.
- Plans are on increase the count of trainers in Mobility, Computer and Call Center Training through external hiring.
- Training for 6 trainees under "Train the Trainer " program is underway.
- External training is being planned to Improve / Enhance communication & soft skills of NABK trainers and trainees.
- NABK now is in the process of rebuilding capacity to train and place 1000 visually impaired beneficiaries in a year.





## **Renovation & Repairs**

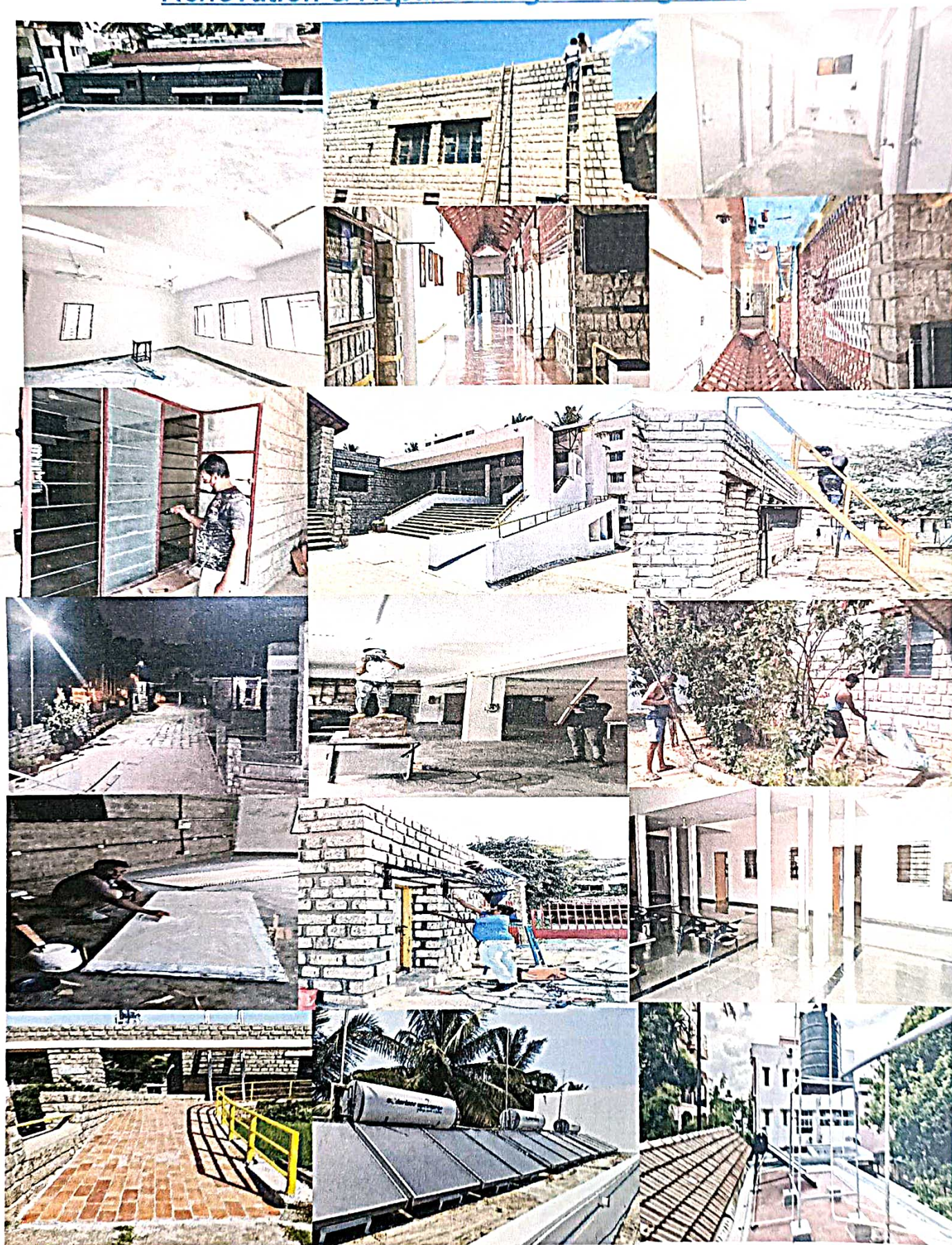

- in case of the Income & Expenditure account, of the excess of income over expenditure for the year ended on that date.



Significant accounting policies & notes to financial statements:

1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statements:

The Financial Statements have been prepared & presented under the historical cost convention, on accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India.

2 Revenue Recognition:

- a) Revenue from voluntary donations and contributions is recognized as and when they are received.
- b) Income from interest on deposits is recognized on accrual basis.

3 Fixed Assets & Depreciation:

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation. Depreciation has been provided on written down value method as per the rates prescribed under section 32 of Income Tax Act, 1961.

4 Expenditure for Charitable Purpose:

All the expenditure incurred towards charitable purposes are charged to Income & Expenditure account for the year.

5 Fees from Life Membership Fees:

Receipt of fees for Life Membership fees is accounted for as part of corpus donations. During the year 2021-22 Life Membership Fees of Rs. 51,000/- has been received.

6 Grants Receivable:

Government grants receivable are accounted on accrual basis.  
Government of Karnataka is reimbursing staff salary and operating expenses of ITCB and staff salary of MTC & TTI. Government of India is re-imbursing part salary of staff and operating expenses of RBTC and placement department.

7 Renewal of Lease agreement:

Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) had allotted the land located at Site No. 4, NAB Road, Jeevan Bhima Nagar, Bangalore for a lease period of 30 years in favour of NAB - Karnataka, which had expired on 03-04-2015. The BDA have vide its letter dated 19th November 2018 has communicated to renew the lease for a further period of 30 years from 03-04-2015 to 02-04-2045 for a total lump sum lease amount of Rs.1,99,29,756/- (Including GST). NAB - Karnataka has requested BDA authorities to provide for annual lease charges. The matter is under litigation and pending for finalisation and accordingly no provision for the rent has been made in the books of accounts in respect of the lease rental charges payable to BDA.
