Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Program

1. <u>Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Program:</u>

- an effort to enhance, facilitate an independent & self-sustained life for visually impaired beneficiaries in the rural segment.

Team conducts :

- Door to door surveys to identify and rehabilitate visually impaired beneficiaries.
- Guides and supports them to avail benefits/facilities extended under government schemes for vision impaired.
- Offers Remote/Online Mobility Training by using our Train-the-Trainer video library, involving Caretakers / Family members of the Vision Impaired (addresses the need of social distancing norms)
- Educates, Train and support them w.r.t Rural and Self Employment

NABK assists :-

- To set up Kirana shops, provides them Weighing scales, supports in getting trained on Animal Husbandry (10days Animal Husbandry training in coordination with RSETI-Canara Bank) and other Local entrepreneurial opportunities / Support them with local employment.
- Helps self-employed visually impaired setup Self Help Group (SHG) or Sangha (a separate legal entity with its own bank account and is managed by visually impaired).









Foundation Course & Job –Oriented Programs

<u>a). Foundation Course :-</u>

- Includes Rehabilitation,Orientation & Mobility, Life Skills, Vocational Training & Placement / Self-Employment.
- Program is a 6-week course covering: Rules of walking in enclosed & public space using a cane, negotiating steps & escalators, commuting using public transport systems, learning techniques to map & memorize routes, layouts in rural and urban areas.

Orientation & Mobility Training, Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Training, Digital Literacy Training and Light Engineering Training to train the visually impaired.

NABK now has the capacity to train and place 1000 visually impaired beneficiaries in a year.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

То

The Governing Council, The National Association For The Blind (NAB), Karnataka

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR THE BLIND (NAB), KARNATAKA BRANCH, a society registered under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act 1960, which comprises of the Balance sheet as at March 31, 2023, Income & Expenditure account and Receipt and Payment account for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Governing Council's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Governing Council is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and the financial performance of the Society. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, subject to the comment in note no. 7 of Significant accounting policies & notes to financials statements, the said financial statements along with the schedules and notes thereon give the information in the manner so required and give a true and fair view:

- i) in case of the Balance Sheet, the state of affairs of The National Association For The Blind (NAB), Karnataka Branch as at March 31, 2023;

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Significant accounting policies & notes to financials statements:

Basis of preparation of Financial Statements: 1

The Financial Statements have been prepared & presented under the historical cost convention, on accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India.

2 Revenue Recognition:

a) Revenue from voluntary donations and contributions is recognized as and when they are received.

b) Income from interest on deposits is recognized on accrual basis.

3 Fixed Assets & Depreciation:

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation. Depreciation has been provided on written down value method as per the rates prescribed under section 32 of Income Tax Act, 1961.

4 Expenditure for Charitable Purpose:

All the expenditure incurred towards charitable purposes are charged to income & Expenditure account for the

5 Fees from Life Membership Fees:

Receipt of fees for Life Membership fees is accounted for as part of corpus donations. During the year 2022-23 Life Membership Fees of Rs. 66,700/- has been received.

6 Grants Receivable:

Government grants receivable are accounted on accrual basis.

Government of Karnataka is reimbursing staff salary and operating expenses of ITCB and staff salary of MTC & TTI. Government of India is re-imbursing part salary of staff and operating expenses of RBTC and placement

7 Renewal of Lease agreement:
